Fleckenstein: There's no chance this ends well. This was extracted from an interview Bill Fleckenstein of Fleckenstein Capital granted to King World News on the nineteenth of August. For those of you who are unfamiliar with Mr. Fleckenstein, he has been what we would call a perpetual bear for at least a couple of decades. Fleckenstein believes that easy monetary policy and high cyclic rate printing presses have led to "a misallocation of capital," and that "no one has seen what happens when central banks print as much (money) as they have since the financial crisis."

While we agree with Mr. Fleckenstein's economic analysis, we do not necessarily agree that there is no chance that it ends well. Well, maybe not well for everybody, much of the Wall Street crowd for instance. This fall voters in the United States will go to the poles in what we opine to a very critical election.
